The LGFB programme is a great way for cancer patients to get back to the person they were—and be happy with the person they are now. During the workshop you meet women, of all ages, in similar situations, share your "war stories" and have fun trying new make-up looks. You can try colours and products you wouldn't normally use. Professional beauty therapists are on hand for advice on how to draw eyebrows and help arrange wigs. It is a very inspiring and positive workshop. If you haven't attended a workshop and would like to please contact our organiser Di Gonse or just let one of the Committee know.

There are over 4,100 stores from which to shop online and they give different percentages but all the small amounts added together help. There are also gift cards from a wide range of stores so when you are stuck for a present for a friend or family member, take a look at the site and see if there is something suitable for the recipient.

#### Used bras please

Bosom Pals are collecting used bras of all sizes & colours at our monthly meetings and these will be sent to Africa where they can potentially save women from rape and/or slavery.

It is an everyday commodity in the UK but to women in Africa a bra could be a critical lifeline. For many African women, underwear is an unattainable expense, while the technology to produce bras is simply not available. Women without bras are perceived to be vulnerable as lack of underwear plays a part in choosing which girls are forced into sex slavery and/or increases the likelihood of being raped.

Owning underwear is seen as a status symbol, indicating that the girl has someone who cares for her, whether that someone is her husband, brother or father. Girls wearing bras are perceived to be from a more privileged background.

#### Sarah Higgins

Sarah Higgins, Oncology Nurse at Bedford Hospital, was nominated by a long-term patient who appreciated Sarah's kindness and ability to put others at ease.

"Sarah had appointments with me over 2021 and 2022. I had been referred to her by my doctor after discovering I have vaginismus. It is something I was very embarrassed over, and found a bit awkward to talk about.

"From the get-go, Sarah made me feel comfortable and made me realise I had nothing to be embarrassed about. She has a way about her that just makes you feel at ease! It was so nice to meet someone who had faith in me over something that I didn't have faith in myself.

"You can tell that she really has a passion in what she does and a passion for helping people. I think the fact that she runs the vaginismus clinic on her day off from her usual duties goes to show that!

"It may not seem like a big deal to some, but vaginismus is really something that can take over you. It makes you believe you'll never be able to have smear tests, never be able to have an adult relationship, or never be able to have babies. I will forever be grateful to Sarah for making all of this possible for me. Without her belief, her words, and her help, I really don't think I'd be where I am today. I get emotional to think about how far I have come in the time I was seeing Sarah. She has enabled me to find joy in something I used to be terrified of. I've managed to do things that I never thought in a million years I'd be able to do.

"She truly deserves recognition for what she does. I know I'm not the only person whose life she's changed and I am positive I won't be the last. Sarah is a credit to her department, a credit to Bedford hospital, and a credit to the NHS as a whole.

of Bedfordshire 2014/15 will be giving his talk "A Year in the Life of a High Sheriff" telling us all about the various events he attended in that capacity.


